

Nate Duval , Poster Artist for Dave Matthews, Phish, Black Keys, Creates Poster to End Corruption

“LAND OF THE FREE (*additional fees may apply*)” posters show that on Independence Day, America is still not completely free from tyranny

Activists from Represent.Us, a movement dedicated to ending legalized bribery and corruption in American government, have teamed up with prominent rock-poster artist Nate Duval to make a bold, grassroots statement on 4-foot posters being put up, guerilla-style, all over the city.

The poster is an effort to raise awareness of how every issue -- guns, climate change, poverty, health care —is paralyzed by a broken political system that is driven by money, not the public interest. **Nate Duval** saw an opportunity to create an iconic message in the spirit of the classic protest posters of the 60s and 70s: Big, bold and undeniably American.

Represent.US Director **Josh Silver** said, “Special interest money pouring down on both political parties is driving partisan gridlock; it’s why Congress can’t pass common sense gun laws the people want. It’s why Congress fails to make headway on virtually every crucial issue this nation faces. It’s why the government is still not ‘of, by and for the people.’

“The crisis has spiraled from bad to absurd. Cockroaches are more popular than the U.S. Congress, according to a [recent survey](#). Nate understands this, and has created another brilliant poster. I’m hopeful that others in the entertainment industry will start giving this issue the attention it needs and deserves.”

Shortly after the action, a very limited edition of signed/numbered artist screenprints will be made available to the general public as a fundraiser for the Represent.Us campaign.
